<p>Did You Know??</p> <p>That the average corn has 800 kernels in 16 rows?</p> <p>There is 1 corn silk for every corn kernel.</p> <p>Americans consume 16.5 billion quarts of popped popcorn annually, more than anyone else in the world.</p> <p>It takes 25 gallons of water to grow one ear of corn.</p> <p>The U.S. produces about 40 percent of the world's corn.</p>	<p>Vegetable of the Month</p> <p>It's Corn Season- Yay! !</p>  <p>Corn is a popular food that's known for its yellow color, its pleasant taste, and its ability to be eaten on the cob. It is often associated with summertime in general. While corn is normally viewed as a vegetable, it is actually a grain, and the exact classification of this mysterious food can be complicated. Corn can benefit your health, as it delivers B vitamins, folate, vitamin C, beta-carotene, protein and fiber. It also contains an abundance of carbohydrates, which can be a good thing to growing children. Carbohydrates that include fiber and nutrients are a source of long lasting energy that children's bodies need on a daily basis. Good carbs can come from pasta; rice, especially whole grain or brown rice; beans; whole grain breads; corn; sweet potatoes or potatoes; low-fat dairy and other fruits and vegetables.</p> <p>My family loves to put fresh ears of corn on the grill, I add it to salads, casseroles for dinner. You might not know what all kinds of foods get made with corn. You recognize corn cob and popcorn. How about Corn Tortillas that are used for tacos and tostadas? We use corn oil and corn meal for baking. Corn syrup is a thick liquid sweetener used in candy making, and lots of other foods. Corn gets made into cereals: Corn Chex, Corn Flakes, Frosted Flakes, Corn Pops, Kix's, etc.</p> <p>You might not know that corn is dried and fed to animals as food: horses, cows, pigs, chickens, lots of farm animals. So the milk you drink and the eggs you eat were made with corn. Corn has lots of good benefits to it and it tastes so good. No matter if you eat it straight off the cob, mixed in a salad, or in your breakfast cereal with milk, corn taste great.</p>
